

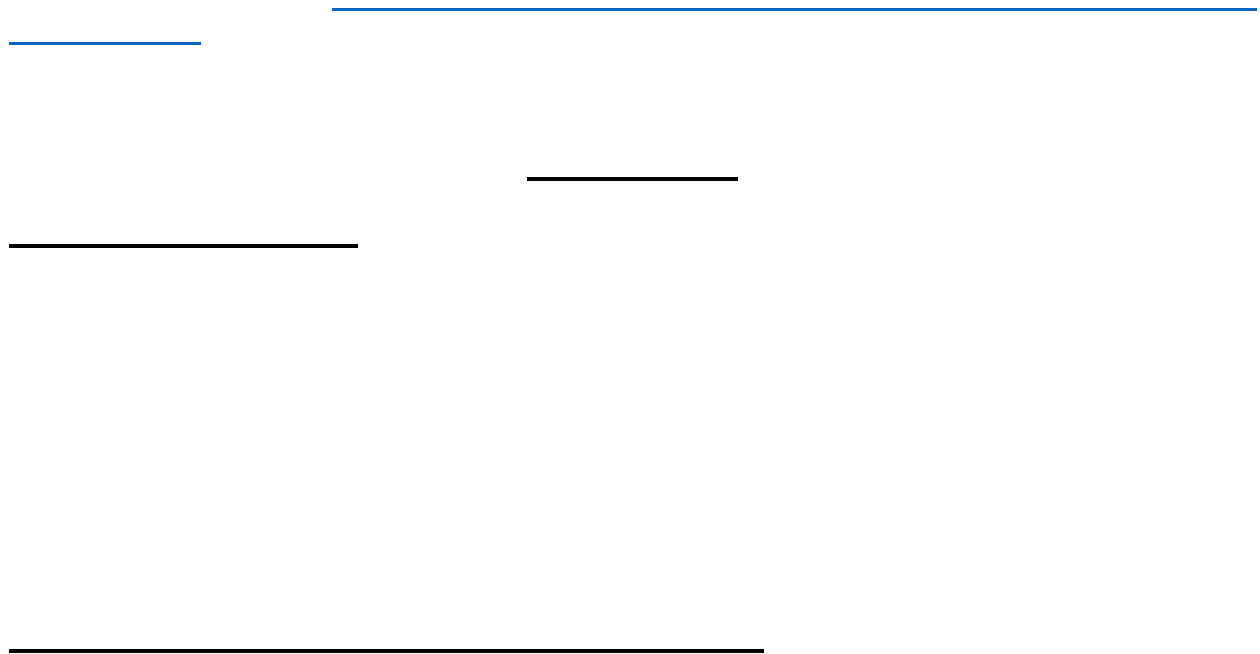
Executive Committee Report

Chapter 516 of the Laws of 2022

Effective August 17, 2022, [Chapter 516 of the Laws of 2022 \(Chapter 516\)](#) amended NYS Education Law to require same day notification to a parent when a school district uses a physical or mechanical restraint and/or places a student with a disability in a time out room. Assistant Commissioner Suriano clarified that mechanical restraints are prohibited in New York and are not an allowable behavior modification intervention. Chapter 516 does not specify the type of notice required (i.e., verbal/ or written). If a parent is unreachable, attempts must be documented and reported to the CSE. NYSED will be issuing guidance to the field regarding chapter 516 in the coming weeks.
