

What do students need to do to earn the NYSSB?

There are mult ple pathways to earn the NYSSB. Whichever pathway is chosen, students must demonstrate the required level of proficiency by earning three (3) points in English and three (3) points in one or more world languages from a points matrix. Students can earn points toward the NYSSB in a number of ways, including earning an 85% or bet er in English or world language coursework, achieving a set score on nat onal tests (such as Advanced Placement, Internat onal Baccalaureate, AAPPL, STAMP4S, or other exams), and complet ng and present ng a Culminat ng Project in English and/or a world language.

How can I support my student to pursue the NYSSB?

First and foremost, if your family speaks a language other than English at home, encourage your student to cont nue to develop their skills in speaking, reading, and writing in that language. As early as possible in high school, talk to your student s school counselor about the possibility of earning the NYSSB and make a mult-year plan for graduat on that culminates in your student earning this award. Discuss with your student the importance of developing proficiency in more than one language and how this might help them in their college and career aspirat ons.
